Thank you for your interest in Troop 713! We are a high adventure troop founded in 1953 that is scout run with strong parent support. Our troop meets approximately every other week on Tuesdays from 7:13 – 8:30 p.m. during the school year at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Del Mar. Many of our parents are merit badge counselors which provides our scouts with ample opportunities to complete merit badges as a group or individually. For those boys interested in rank advancement, our older scouts and parent leaders are there to help and encourage them along their way. All of our scouts are required to participate annually in our two fundraisers and to complete 6 hours of service project time.

Troop meetings and outings are well attended by our large group of scouts. In order for these meetings and other troop events to run smoothly, our scouts agree to conduct themselves responsibly and respectfully. We ask that each boy and his parent review and sign the Troop 713 Membership Agreement.

Our active troop requires the time and talent of all of our parents. Should your son become a troop member, we will need your help in whatever way you can contribute: camping with the boys, leading the boys as merit badge counselors, assisting with the administrative operations of our troop, helping with Eagle Scout projects, assisting with our fundraisers, or driving boys to scout events.

  - c. Signed Membership Agreement
  - d. Completed and signed Adult Application (only Pages 4 and 5 of the .pdf) if interested
  - e. A check, payable to BSA Troop 713, for the prorated dues amount.
  - f. If you would like to be a parent volunteer, please include a note describing how you would like to help. We greatly appreciate and need our volunteers! No parent job is too small!
  - g. If your son is bridging into our troop, please include a note stating your son's current Pack number.

### **Active Scout Participation**

Scouts are required to attend 60% (typically 5 out of 8 per term) of scheduled troop outings (overnight camping trips and day trips), 50% of troop meetings, 50% of patrol meetings, participating in 2 fundraisers (annually), and 6 hours of service project worked per year. This is the criteria used for signatures for rank required active scout participation.
